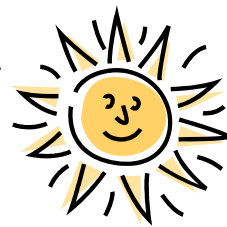


# HAMPTON TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DISTRICT SUMMER PROGRAM 2010

## #017 SCRAPBOOKING

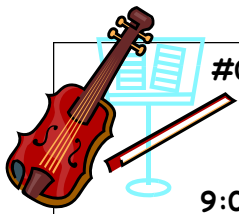
### SESSION II ONLY

The Holocaust is one of the most famous or infamous events in human history. This course will explore the event we call the Holocaust through the use of primary sources and first-hand accounts. The course will examine the events and history of anti-Semitism in Europe and the world. We will explore how the Nazis turned anti-Semitism into the Holocaust. Special attention will be given to the events of the 1930s in Germany and how they created politics to racism that led to the final solution. A framework will be developed that follows the events from the early policies of persecution to the final solution of extermination.
