



COVID-19 Weekly Summary Report

April 2, 2021

Dear Hampton Families:

Allegheny County’s incidence rate per 100,000 cases is 155.8, and the percent positivity is 8.8%. The County remains at the **High** Transmission Level using CDC guidance. Hampton’s local data includes three in-school cases at the High School and no in-school cases at the Middle School.

The following guidance for specific timelines of the transition to additional in-person instruction days was established after the March 29 school board meeting.

- If the case count reaches <100 per 100,000 by April 9, 5-day in-person instruction will begin on April 12. (CDC Substantial = PDE Moderate)
- If the case count is < 100 per 100,000 by April 16, 5-day in-person instruction may begin on April 19, using CDC Substantial vs. High as the guide.
- During the April 12 board meeting, we will review current data and any additional PDE, ACHD, or CDC guidance to inform reopening planning.
