



COVID-19 Weekly Summary Report

April 9, 2021

Dear Hampton Families:

Allegheny County’s incidence rate per 100,000 cases is 177.4, and the percent positivity is 9.6%. The County remains at a **High** Transmission Level using CDC guidance.

As the County remains at a High Transmission Level, with a case count well above 100 per 100,000, Hampton Middle School and Hampton High School will **not** return to complete in-person instruction on Monday, April 12. However, the school board will review current data and propose an alternate reopening plan for Hampton High School and Hampton Middle School at the April 12 Board meeting (Hampton Middle School Auditorium, 5:30 pm).
