Hampton Township, located 10 miles north of Pittsburgh, is a flourishing suburban community of over 18,000 residents. It is home to mostly skilled and professional workers who typically are employed in the metropolitan area. On average, the High School comprises 1,006 students in grades nine through 12 and has a strong academic tradition characterized by its rigorous, yet caring, atmosphere.

Academic achievement is exemplary, with over 90 percent of all graduates continuing their education and average College Board scores consistently above state and national averages.

Twenty-one Advanced Placement (AP) courses are available across multiple grade levels. Last year, over 500 AP exams were completed by Hampton High School students with an overwhelming majority earning scores which qualify for college credit. There are 30 Honors courses offered across multiple disciplines and grade levels.

In addition to AP and College-in-High-School courses, Hampton High School provides a comprehensive and diversified curriculum. It holds articulation agreements with the University of Pittsburgh, Duquesne University and Washington and Jefferson College through the College-in-High-School program. Students must earn a minimum of 25 credits for graduation, including at least 40 hours of community service.

Distinctions and Awards

- Hampton High School was named a National Blue Ribbon School in 2016 the second time the school has received the designation since 1998.
- U.S. News and World Report ranked Hampton 11th in the state of Pennsylvania. They rank the top 500 schools in the state. There are 678 high schools in Pennsylvania. In addition, we were ranked 622 nationally.
- Pittsburgh Business Times ranked HHS in the number four spot regionally out of 102 schools in its 2017 Guide to Western Pennsylvania Schools.
- NerdWallet named Allison Park among its Top 10 Places for Young Families to Live. Allison Park was ranked number nine due to the quality of Hampton Township School District.
- Hampton High School was named among the best 1,000 public high schools in the nation in 2013 by Newsweek Magazine, and its online partner, The Daily Beast. HHS was ranked 607.
- Hampton High School was ranked at number 86 out of 8,738 schools in the nation by Niche.com as part of its 2015 Best School Districts in America list.
- Hampton scored above average on the SAT and ACT. The national average for the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing portion of the SAT was 538, with the Pennsylvania average at 540. Hampton students scored 609. Hampton students also excelled on the Mathematics portion of the SAT, with an average score of 597 compared with 533 both statewide and nationally.
- Approximately 90% of the class of 2016 plan to attend a 2 year or 4 year college, 2.5% plan to attend a technical school, 4% plan to seek employment, 2% plan to join a branch of the military, and 1.5% were undecided about their post-secondary plans.
- There were 532 AP exams taken in the Spring of 2017 with 465 of students (87.4%) scoring a 3.0 or higher on the exams.
