

There are local vendors that take recycled items year-round, in and around Hampton Township. Many of them will make arrangements to pick up recycled items. Following is a select list of vendors who offer recycling services:

- **Global Links** – Accepts crutches, canes and wheelchairs in good condition – www.globallinks.org;
- **Construction Junction** – Accepts building refuse for recycling and reuse – www.constructionjunction.org;
- **eLoop** – Accepts computers, laptops and TVs. Fees are charged per item – www.eloopllc.com;
- **Salvation Army** – Accepts donated goods such as clothing, furniture, household items and cars – www.use.salvationarmy.org;
- **Amvets** – Accepts clothing, draperies, curtains, toys, games, bikes, toys and some small appliances. They will pick up donated items at your house – www.pickupplease.org or 800-775-8387;
- **Free Ride!** – Accepts bicycles and bicycle gear, such as helmets. Items are then available for reuse – www.freeridepgh.org;
- **Freecycle** – This is a grassroots, nonprofit movement of people who are giving and getting stuff for free in their own towns. It promotes reuse and keeping good stuff out of landfills – www.freecycle.org;
- **Loves** – The Route 8 location (near Target) accepts rechargeable batteries from cell phones, cordless power tools, laptops, PDAs, two-way radios, camcorders and remote-control toys;
- **Central Elementary School** – Accepts printer cartridges and cell phones for recycling; and
- **Abitibi Dumpsters** – These dumpsters are located throughout Allegheny County and take paper products for recycling. Local locations include Central and Wyland Elementary Schools and Hampton Middle and High Schools.
