The School Community

Hampton Township, located 10 miles north of Pittsburgh, is a flourishing suburban community of over 18,000 residents. It is home to mostly skilled and professional workers who typically are employed in the metropolitan area. On average, the High School comprises 1,006 students in grades nine through 12 and has a strong academic tradition characterized by its rigorous, yet caring, atmosphere.

Academic achievement is exemplary, with over 90 percent of all graduates continuing their education and average College Board scores consistently above state and national averages.

Twenty-three Advanced Placement (AP) courses are available across multiple grade levels. Last year, 695 AP exams were completed by Hampton High School students with an overwhelming majority earning scores which qualify for college credit. There are 33 Honors courses offered across multiple disciplines and grade levels.

In addition to AP and College-in-High-School courses, Hampton High School provides a comprehensive and diversified curriculum. It holds articulation agreements with the University of Pittsburgh, Duquesne University and Washington and Jefferson College through the College in High School program. Students must earn a minimum of 25 credits for graduation, including at least 40 hours of community service.

Distinctions and Awards

- Hampton High School was named a National Blue Ribbon School in 2016 - the second time the school has received the designation since 1998.
- Hampton was inducted into the League of Innovative Schools in August 2019. The league is a national coalition of forward-thinking school districts organized by Digital Promise. Selection to the league is highly competitive.
- **U.S. News and World Report** ranked Hampton 4th in the Pittsburgh area and 11th in the state of Pennsylvania. They rank the top 500 schools in the state. There are 678 high schools in Pennsylvania. In addition, we were ranked 712 nationally.
- **Pittsburgh Business Times** ranked HHS in the number six spot regionally out of 102 schools in its 2019 Guide to Western Pennsylvania Schools.
- NerdWallet named Allison Park among its Top 10 Places for Young Families to Live. Allison Park was ranked number nine due to the quality of Hampton Township School District.
- Hampton High School was ranked at number 5 in Niche.com's 2020 Best School Districts in Pittsburgh Area.
- Hampton scored above average on the SAT and ACT. The national average for the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing portion of the SAT was 531, with the Pennsylvania average at 545. Hampton students scored 608. Hampton students also excelled on the Mathematics portion of the SAT, with an average score of 607 compared with 537 statewide and 528 nationally.
- 91% of the class of 2019 plan to attend a 2 year or 4 year college, 3% plan to attend a technical school, 4% plan to seek employment, 1% plan to join a branch of the military, and 1% were undecided about their post-secondary plans.
- There were 695 AP exams taken during the 2018-2019 School Year, with 601 students (86%) scoring a 3.0 or higher on the exams.

Hampton High School Named National Blue Ribbon School

Hampton High School was named a National Blue Ribbon School for 2016. It is the second time the school has received this designation.

“As the principal of Hampton High School, I am proud that our well-established K-12 academic program is being honored at the national level,” said Dr. Marguerite Imbarlina. “I offer congratulations to the students, faculty, administrators, and staff members for earning this prestigious award. Earning the National Blue Ribbon is a clear indicator that Hampton High School students are academically prepared to embrace unique opportunities and to address new challenges. Additionally, this recognition is an example of what can be accomplished when a community continuously supports its children and academic programs.”

U.S. Secretary of Education John B. King Jr. congratulated the 329 schools being honored as National Blue Ribbon Schools. Schools are selected for the honor based on their overall academic excellence or their progress in closing achievement gaps among student subgroups. According to the U.S. Department of Education, the award is confirmation of the hard work of students, educators, families and communities in creating safe and welcoming schools, where students master challenging content.

All schools are recognized in one of two performance categories:

- Exemplary High Performing Schools – schools in this category are among their state’s highest-performing schools as measured by state assessments or nationally-normed tests.
- Exemplary Achievement Gap Closing Schools – schools in this category are among their state’s highest-performing schools in closing achievement gaps between a school’s subgroups and all students over the past five years.

Placement is based on all student scores, subgroup student scores and graduation rates. Hampton High School is being recognized as an Exemplary High Performing School.
